SCHOLARSHIP FORM/APPLICATION

Dear Applicant:

The 100 Black Men of Greater Beaumont Organization is committed to the growth and development of America's youth. In addition to engaging in mentoring, education, health & wellness, and economic empowerment programs, it is important to assist in developing talented young Americans in pursuit of higher education.

The 100 Black Men of Greater Beaumont Scholarship Program is available to students entering and maintaining full-time status at an approved, accredited, post-secondary institution beginning in the fall of the current year. Applicants must meet ALL the ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA and deadlines to qualify. Any scholarship award should be applied toward tuition, room, board, and books. Checks are mailed from the Beaumont office and made payable to the certified institution. Individuals applying for a scholarship must forward one completed application packet to the address below. Scholarship recipients must (1) re-apply each year, (2) visit a minimum of one 100 BMGB meeting, (3) provide a progress report and transcript following each semester, mailed to the chapter at the chapter address and (4) maintain frequent contact with their assigned 100BMGB Mentor. **Application packets along with a professional headshot photo must be postmarked no later than March 13, 2026. Facsimiles and incomplete packets will not be accepted. We plan to review applications by March 16, 2026. Mail your complete application packets to:**

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- High school student transitioning to higher education at Lamar University, (LU).
- Lamar State College - Port Arthur, Lamar State College- Orange and/or Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HCBUs)
 - Minimum grade point average of 2.5
 - Plans to attend school for the entire academic year, beginning in the fall.

 - Lamar University affiliated colleges, such as Lamar Institute of Technology.
 - Completed community service within past 12 months with verifiable documentation.
 - Leadership involvement

The 100 Black Men of Greater Beaumont's Scholarship Application is available after August of each year and may be acquired from the local chapter or through access of the chapter website www.100bmgb.org. It will also be made available through the BISD and PAISD. The completed applications must be typed or printed legibly.

Each finalist applicant will be scheduled for an in-person interview at the IOOBMGB office, (700 North Street,) Beaumont, TX or via Zoom. Finalist applicants will be notified of the time and date of the interview.

Essay

***Applicants are required to submit a typed and double-spaced 600-word minimum essay on the following topic. Your essay must be forwarded along with your completed application.

Write an essay on one of the following topics:

- What is your view on the impact of the judicial system in this country, and how it has affected or will affect you and your community?
- What is your view of the importance of honesty and integrity, and how have these traits affected this country?

Applicants must provide an official academic transcript from their most recent school or college. Transcripts must be included in the packets.

Confirmation of Community Service Form

Applicants are asked to share a report of community service activities within the 12 months preceding the application deadline. Students who are awarded a 100 Black Men Scholarship are required to complete an additional 25 hours of "active" community service within 12-months after the scholarship is awarded each year. Scholarship applicants and recipients should complete and submit the Confirmation of Community Service Form as verification of service performed. Applicants and recipients may make copies of the form as needed.

"Active" service shall be defined as "An activity that allows one to extend themselves in service to another without compensation, remuneration, personal gain or benefit" See below for a sampling of acceptable projects:



- o Ex. 1 ACTIVE SERVICE — Acceptable Service Projects (serving food to the homeless through soup kitchen or shelter, tutoring students, picking up litter and recycling, coordinating a community food/shelter drive).
- o Ex. 2 PASSIVE SERVICE — Unacceptable Service Project (donating food/clothing in a clothing drive, babysitting, singing in a choir, serving as an officer in a civic organization).
